Element Hardware Cleaning Instructions

Important precautions before cleaning your Element product

- Turn off the power to the system and disconnect the power cable.
- Use a microfiber cloth.
- Never spray or pour the disinfecting liquid directly onto the product. Always spray it into the cloth, and make sure no liquid is dripping from the cloth.

Cleaning/disinfecting procedure for PCAP touchscreens

- 1. Turn off the power and disconnect the power cord.
- 2. Dampen a clean microfibre cloth with your Isopropyl alcohol 70%-75%*. Ensure there is no fire or heat in the vicinity as alcohol is flammable.
- **3.** Do NOT spray the disinfectant directly onto the system. Ensure there is no liquid dripping from the cloth.
- 4. Disinfect the surfaces of the product starting with the touch screen, as it is the area that is touched the most.
- 5. Let the system dry before reconnecting power.

Do NOT use any other products to clean the system.

* Isopropyl alcohol 70%-75% is a recommended disinfection product by WHO and tested by Element. It is suitable for PCAP touch screens.

Cleaning procedure for resistive touch screens

- 1. Use a soft lint-free cloth.
- 2. The cloth may be used dry, or lightly dampened with a mild cleaner or Ethanol.
- Suitable cleaning products are commercially available pre-packaged for use; one example of such a product is <u>Klear Screen™</u>, or commercially available off-the-shelf retail brands such as Glass Plus® Glass and Surface Cleaner made by <u>Reckitt-Benckiser</u>. Cleaner must be neither acid nor alkali (neutral pH).
- 4. Be sure the cloth is only lightly dampened, not wet. Never apply cleaner directly to touch panel surface; if cleaner is spilled onto touch panel, soak it up immediately with absorbent cloth.
- 5. When using cleaner, avoid contact with the edges of the film or glass, and with the flex tail.
- 6. Wipe the surface gently; if there is a directional surface texture, wipe in the same direction as the texture.
- 7. Never use acidic or alkaline cleaners, or organic chemicals such as: paint thinner, acetone, tolulene, xylene, propyl or isopropyl alchohol, or kerosene.
- 8. Use of incorrect cleaners can result in optical impairment of touch panel and/or damage to functionality.
